SPECIAL PUBLIC SAFETY MINUTES Wednesday, June 17, 2020 @ 5:30 p.m. GoToMeeting

Call to Order:

Jenson called the meeting to order at 5:32 p.m.

<u>Discussion and possible action regarding amending section 6-10 of the Stoughton Municipal</u> Code regarding leashed animals in public places

Motion by Ligocki, second by Ligocki to recommend that council approve amending section 6-10 of the Stoughton Municipal Code regarding leashed animals in public places. Motion carried 5-0.

Communications:

Approval of the May 27, 2020 Public Safety Committee Minutes:

Motion by Doom, second by Ligocki to approve the minutes. Motion carried 5-0.

<u>Discussion and possible action regarding a special event application submitted by Dylan</u> Bennett for extended use of amplified sound located at 216 E Main St.

Ligocki and Riley spoke saying they support the work the group is doing, but didn't feel comfortable approving the permit for that entire length of time. The committee directed Clerk Licht to invite Dylan Bennett to the next meeting to see if they could come to a compromise on the hours of use of the megaphone and other amplified sound. Motion by Ligocki, second by Riley to postpone until the next meeting. Motion carried 5-0.

<u>Discussion and possible action regarding outdoor consumption of alcohol during local state of emergency</u>

Chief stated allowing out door consumption would make enforcing downtown open intoxicants hard to enforce. Clerk Licht explained that the committee would need to review every request on a case-by-case basis. She added that the licensee would need to submit an amended premise description and an outdoor consumption permit application. She noted that the committee would have the authority to place conditions on the license if needed.

Discussion and possible action regarding liquor license fees for the 2020-2021 license year

Clerk Licht said that there was a request by a licensee to either reduce fees or allow for a payment plan. She stated that the City has an ordinance that does not allow her to issue licenses to any individual or business if any unpaid fees are due including license fees, taxes and

utility bills. The committee directed Clerk Licht to contact the business owner and invite them to the next meeting if the fees had still not been paid.

Discussion regarding Stoughton Police Policies/Activities

Chief Leck stated that the Wisconsin requires 11 policies by statute, the City has 100 policies and more in the works. Policies are reviewed every other year and he department is currently reviewing policies. The committee discussed use of force policy. Chief Leck also stated that officers in Stoughton receive well over the minimum amount of training per year.

Adjournment:

Motion by Riley, second by Ligocki to adjourn at 7:20 p.m. Motion carried 5-0.

Stoughton Wine Walk – October 15th, 2020

In compliance with state and local ordinances, the following guidelines will be presented and abided by our participating wine-stop businesses. The following stakeholders from here will be Chamber of Commerce and Wine Walk Committee ("Chamber"), Sponsors and Host stops ("Businesse"), "Businesses"), and Attendees ("Attendees").

- No more than 20 "Businesses" will sign up to be a host stop, offering a sampling of 1 red and 1 white wine to each participant. The 2020 event will have 10 "businesses" participating as wine stops. Other downtown establishments are urged to stay open for longer business hours to allow for the "attendees" to do extra shopping.
- "Chamber" will be responsible for providing a bartender for all stops. Priority will be given to the bartenders that served in 2019.
- "Chamber" will be responsible for obtaining the City of Stoughton Temporary Operator's (Bartender's) License for each pourer.
- "Chamber" will provide to "Businesses" and bartenders a training and expectation guide no later than two weeks prior to event.
- "Chamber" will purchase wine through a licensed wine distributor and disseminate to "Business" the day of event.
- Wine samples are limited to 1 oz pours. This will be monitored by using a designated bottle pourer or a measured, pre-poured, glass (ex. shot glass).
- Restaurants will be requested to offer a special Wine Walk food special. No food samples are permitted following the Dane Forward plan.
- Water will be available at no additional cost to the attendees.
- Each "Business" will include a waste bucket at the door to comply with no beer/alcohol on city walks/streets.
- Registration will be at Kegonsa Plaza with ease of parking for the attendees in Kegonsa parking lot.
- A total of 400 tickets will be available to purchase for 2020's event, and split between two time frames.
- The event as a whole will follow the City's Best Practices in conjunction with the state regulations.
- Event Date: Thursday, October 15, 2020
- Event Time: 4:00 5:30pm and 6:00 7:30pm

Stoughton Wine Walk – October 15th, 2020

- Goal 1: To increase awareness and spending to downtown businesses
- Goal 2: To fund the Rae Ladd Scholarship to 2 high school seniors exemplifying their volunteer service commitments.



Wine or Beer Walks Alcohol Beverage Laws Fact Sheet 3109

revenue.wi.gov

This fact sheet provides information about the licensing requirements for a wine or beer walk.

A "wine walk" or "beer walk" is a single-day event at which customers are served a glass of beer or wine at multiple locations (e.g., jewelry stores, art galleries, clothing boutiques, salons, furniture stores) during their shopping visits.

Wisconsin law authorizes a municipality to issue Temporary Class "B" (beer) licenses and Temporary "Class B" (wine only) licenses to a qualified organization, including a chamber of commerce or similar civic or trade organization organized under ch. 181, Wis. Stats., to promote economic growth and opportunity within a local geographical area.

Wine Walk

A municipality may issue up to 20 Temporary "Class B" (wine only) licenses to a qualified organization for a wine walk for a specific date and time. The following requirements apply:

- The licenses must be issued to a single qualified organization that is the sponsor of the wine walk
- The licenses must be issued for the same date and time
- An admission fee must be charged for participation and no additional fee can be charged for the wine
- A municipality may authorize the licensee to permit unaccompanied underage persons on the licensee's premises only if the underage person is acting as a designated driver and has been provided a means of identification, such as a wristband, by the licensee
- No person may serve wine after 9 p.m. on premises for which Temporary "Class B" (wine only) licenses are issued for a wine walk
- A qualified organization may receive Temporary "Class B" (wine only) licenses for up to two events during a 12-month period (multiple licenses issued for a wine walk are considered one event)
- A municipality may issue Temporary "Class B" (wine only) licenses for a total of up to two wine walks during a 12-month period
- A licensed premises, such as a restaurant or tavern, may participate in the wine walk but the sponsoring organization cannot be issued a temporary license for a premises that already holds a license

Beer Walk

A municipality may issue Temporary Class "B" (beer) licenses to a qualified organization for a beer walk for a specific date and time. The following requirements apply:

 The Temporary Class "B" (beer) licenses must be issued to a single qualified organization that is the sponsor of the beer walk

- . The Temporary Class "B" (beer) licenses must be issued for the same date and time
- An admission fee must be charged for participation in the event and no additional fee can be charged for service of the beer
- Municipalities may authorize a Temporary Class "B" (beer) licensee to permit underage persons on the premises for which a beer license is issued
- No person may serve beer after 12 midnight on premises for which Temporary Class "B" (beer) licenses are issued for a beer walk
- There is no limit to the number of Temporary Class "B" (beer) licenses a municipality may issue to a
 qualified organization, or a limit on the number of Temporary Class "B" (beer) licenses that may be issued
 for beer walk events during a 12-month period

Additional Alcohol Beverage Licensing Requirements

Requirements that apply to other alcohol beverage licensees also apply to Temporary "Class B"/Class "B" licenses issued to chambers of commerce and similar organizations, including:

- Licensed operators, or those with privileges of an operator's license, must be present on the licensed premises to serve the wine/beer and/or supervise the service of wine/beer
- Temporary operator's licenses may be issued to persons employed by or donating their services to the qualified organization for the event
- Licensees must purchase all wine or beer from:
 - Liquor or beer wholesalers
 - o Small winery cooperative wholesalers authorized to sell wine to retail licensees
 - Breweries/brewpubs authorized to self-distribute to retail licensees

Licensed Operators

Each premises on the wine or beer walk must have licensed operators or those with privileges of an operator's license present to serve or supervise the service of the wine or beer. Licensed operators are persons holding an operator's license, often called a "bartender's license".

- Temporary operator's licenses may be issued to persons employed by or donating services to the qualified organization for the event
- A person may hold two temporary operator licenses per year
- An operator's license is valid only within the municipality where issued

License Applications

Applications for temporary licenses to hold a wine or beer walk should be submitted to the municipality by the qualified organization using the Application for Temporary Class "B" / "Class B" Retailer's License (Form AT-315). Either of the following methods may be used to submit an application:

- A list of each participating location, describing the premises
- A separate application for each of the multiple locations participating in the wine or beer walk

2015 WISCONSIN ACT 62

AN ACT to renumber and amend 125.51 (10); to amend 125.17 (4) (b), 125.26 (6), 125.51 (3) (f) and 125.68 (4) (c) 1.; and to create 125.02 (3u), 125.07 (3) (a) 12m., 125.32 (3m) (j), 125.51 (10) (b) and 125.68 (4) (c) 6. of the statutes; relating to: temporary alcohol beverage retail licenses and temporary alcohol beverage operator's licenses.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. 125.02 (3u) of the statutes is created to read:

125.02 (3u) "Chamber of commerce" means a local chamber of commerce organized under ch. 181 or a similar civic or trade organization organized under ch. 181 to promote economic growth and opportunity within a local geographical area.

SECTION 1g. 125.07 (3) (a) 12m. of the statutes is created to read:

125.07 (3) (a) 12m. An underage person who enters and remains on premises covered by a temporary "Class B" license issued as provided in s. 125.51 (10) (b) if all of the following apply:

- a. The municipal governing body issuing the license, or an official or body authorized by the municipal governing body, authorizes the licensee to permit underage persons to be on the licensed premises for the purpose of acting as designated drivers.
- b. The licensee permits, on the licensed premises, unaccompanied underage persons to be present only for the purpose of acting as designated drivers and the licensee provides a means of identification, such as a wrist band, to identify these underage persons as designated drivers.

c. The underage person is present on the licensed premises to act as a designated driver and displays the means of identification specified in subd. 12m. b.

SECTION 1r. 125.17 (4) (b) of the statutes is amended o read:

125.17 (4) (b) No person may hold more than one license 2 licenses of this kind per year.

SECTION 2. 125.26 (6) of the statutes is amended to read:

125.26 (6) Temporary Class "B" licenses may be issued to bona fide clubs and chambers of commerce, to county or local fair associations or agricultural societies, to churches, lodges or societies that have been in existence for at least 6 months before the date of application, and to posts of veterans organizations authorizing the sale of fermented malt beverages at a particular picnic or similar gathering, at a meeting of the post, or during a fair conducted by the fair association or agricultural society. The amount of the fee for the license shall be determined by the municipal governing body issuing the license but may not exceed \$10. An official or body authorized by a municipal governing body to issue temporary Class "B" licenses may, upon issuance of any temporary Class "B" license, authorize the licensee to permit underage persons to be on the premises for which the license is issued. A license issued to a county or district fair licenses the entire fairgrounds where the fair is being con-

ducted and all persons engaging in retail sales of fermented malt beverages from leased stands on the fairgrounds. The county or district fair to which the license is issued may lease stands on the fairgrounds to persons who may engage in retail sales of fermented malt beverages from the stands while the fair is being held. A municipal governing body may issue a temporary Class "B" license for premises that are covered by a "Class B" permit issued under s. 125.51 (5) (b) 2. if the applicant meets the requirements of this subsection. If a license is issued under this subsection to a fair association solely for the purpose of conducting on the licensed premises fermented malt beverages judging or tasting events involving servings of fermented malt beverages no greater than one fluid ounce each, s. 125.32 (2) does not apply to these licensed premises.

SECTION 3. 125.32 (3m) (j) of the statutes is created to read:

125.32 (3m) (j) Premises for which a temporary Class "B" license is issued under s. 125.26 (6) if the license is one of multiple licenses issued by the municipality to the same licensee for the same date and times, the licensee is the sponsor of an event held at multiple locations within the municipality on this date and at these times, and an admission fee is charged for participation in the event and no additional fee is charged for service of alcohol at the event.

SECTION 4. 125.51 (3) (f) of the statutes is amended to read:

125.51 (3) (f) A "Class B" license may be issued only to a holder of a retail Class "B" license to sell fermented malt beverages unless the "Class B" license is the kind of "Class B" license specified under par. (am) or is a temporary "Class B" license under sub. (10).

SECTION 5. 125.51 (10) of the statutes is renumbered 125.51 (10) (a) and amended to read:

125.51 (10) (a) Notwithstanding s. 125.68 (3), temporary "Class B" licenses may be issued to bona fide clubs and chambers of commerce, to county or local fair associations or agricultural societies, to churches, lodges, or societies that have been in existence for at least 6 months before the date of application, and to posts of veterans' organizations authorizing the sale of wine in an original package, container, or bottle or by the glass if the wine is dispensed directly from an original package, container, or bottle at a particular picnic or similar gathering, at a meeting of the post, or during a fair conducted by the fair association or agricultural society. The amount of the fee for the license shall be determined by the municipal governing body issuing the license but may not exceed \$10, except that no fee may be charged to a person who at the same time applies for a temporary Class "B" license under s. 125.26 (6) for the same event. A license issued to a county or district fair licenses the entire fairgrounds where the fair is being conducted and all persons engaging in retail sales of wine from leased stands on the

fairgrounds. The county or district fair to which the license is issued may lease stands on the fairgrounds to persons who may engage in retail sales of wine from the stands while the fair is being held. If a county or district fair leases any stand to a winery holding a permit under s. 125.53, in addition to making retail sales of wine from the leased stand, the winery may provide taste samples anywhere on the fairgrounds of wine manufactured by the winery. If a license is issued under this subsection paragraph to a fair association solely for the purpose of conducting on the licensed premises wine judging or tasting events involving servings of wine no greater than one fluid ounce each, s. 125.68 (2) does not apply to these licensed premises. Not Except as provided in par. (b), not more than 2 licenses may be issued under this subsection paragraph to any club, chamber of commerce, county or local fair association, agricultural association, church, lodge, society, or veterans post in any 12-month period.

SECTION 6. 125.51 (10) (b) of the statutes is created to read:

125.51 (10) (b) 1. A municipality may issue up to 20 licenses under par. (a) to the same licensee if all of the following apply:

- a. Each license is issued for the same date and times and the licensee is the sponsor of an event held at multiple locations within the municipality on this date and at these times.
- b. An admission fee is charged for participation in the event and no additional fee is charged for service of alcohol at the event.
- c. Within the immediately preceding 12-month period, the municipality has issued licenses under authority of this paragraph for fewer than 2 events.
- 2. The duration of an event under subd. 1. may not exceed one day.
- 3. For purposes of the 2-license limit imposed under par. (a), each event for which multiple licenses are issued as provided in subd. 1. shall count as one license toward this 2-license limit.
- 4. A municipal governing body or an official or body authorized by a municipal governing body to issue temporary "Class B" licenses may, upon issuance of a temporary "Class B" license as provided in subd. 1., authorize the licensee to permit underage persons to be on the licensed premises for the purpose of acting as designated drivers.

SECTION 6g. 125.68 (4) (c) 1. of the statutes is amended to read:

125.68 (4) (c) 1. Subject to subd., subds., 3. and 6. and s. 125.51 (3r) (a) 3., no premises for which a "Class B" license or permit or a "Class C" license has been issued may remain open between the hours of 2 a.m. and 6 a.m., except as otherwise provided in this subdivision and subd. 4. On January 1 premises operating under a "Class B" license or permit are not required to close. On Saturday and Sunday, no premises may remain open between

2:30 a.m. and 6 a.m. except that, on the Sunday that daylight saving time begins as specified in s. 175.095 (2), no premises may remain open between 3:30 a.m. and 6 a.m. This subdivision does not apply to a "Class B" license issued to a winery under s. 125.51 (3) (am).

SECTION 6r. 125.68 (4) (c) 6. of the statutes is created to read:

125.68 (4) (c) 6. No person may serve wine after 9 p.m. on premises covered by a temporary "Class B" license issued as provided in s. 125.51 (10) (b).

SECTION 7. Nonstatutory provisions.

(1) PUBLICATION 302 AND WINE WALKS. The department of revenue shall update the discussion of "wine walks" in its Publication 302, Wisconsin Alcohol Beverage and Tobacco Laws for Retailers, to reflect statutory changes in this act.

SECTION 8m. Effective dates. This act takes effect on the day after publication, except as follows:

(1) Section 7 of this act takes effect on the first day of the 2nd month beginning after publication.


