5. <u>O-27-14-</u> Proposed ordinance amendments to the City of Stoughton Municipal Code of Ordinances, Chapter 78, Section 78-105(5)(a)2b and to Appendix C related to commercial animal boarding.

On November 10, 2014 the Planning Commission held a public hearing, reviewed this ordinance amendment and recommend Council approval to allow commercial animal boarding as a conditional use within the Planned Industrial district. The ordinance, minutes and related materials are provided. (*Recommend approval* 7-0)

6. <u>O-31-14-</u> Proposed ordinance amendment to the City of Stoughton Municipal Code of Ordinances, Chapter 6, Section 6-14, Kennels.

On November 10, 2014 the Planning Commission reviewed this ordinance amendment and recommend Council approval with "as pets or" being removed from the draft. The intent is to provide consistency with the kennel language in chapter 78 and chapter 6. The ordinance, minutes and related materials are provided. (*Recommend approval* 7-0) **SECOND READING**

7. O-34-2014- Authorizing and directing the proper City officials to adopt modifications to Subsections 74-112 (Minimum monthly wastewater service charge.) and 74-113 (In addition to the minimum monthly charge based on meter size, there shall be a charge for all flow based on water usage as determined by the water utility, at the rate of \$4.05 per 1,000 gals, effective July 20, 2006, \$4.55 per 1,000 gals, effective January 1, 2007 and \$4.96 per 1,000 gals, effective July 5, 2007 of the City of Stoughton Municipal Code of Ordinances. (Utilities committee recommends approval 5-0)
