Application for an Outdoor Alcohol Consumption Permit: Bella Roma located at 620 Nygaard Street. Fred Kropp, Greg King: At last months meeting we discussed the noise ordinance we would enforce. I have included the relevant ordinances for part of the discussion reference.

50-5(C)

- (c) Prohibition of noises disturbing the public peace.
- (1) No person shall make or assist in making any noise tending to unreasonably disturb the peace and quiet of any person in the vicinity thereof, unless the making and continuing of the noise cannot be prevented and is necessary for the protection or preservation of property or of the health, safety, life or limb of some person.
- (2) No person occupying or having charge of any building or premises or any part thereof shall cause, suffer or allow any loud, excessive or unusual noise in the operation or use of any radio, phonograph or instrument or machine, which loud, excessive or unusual noise tends to unreasonably disturb the comfort, quiet or repose of persons therein or in the vicinity.

Sec. 58-2. Public nuisance defined.

A public nuisance is a thing, act, occupation, condition or use of property which shall continue for such length of time as to:

(1) Substantially annoy, injure or endanger the comfort, health, repose or safety of the public.

14-40(k) Miscellaneous rules.

- (6) Permits for outdoor consumption at Class B premises.
- a. Required for outdoor consumption. No licensee shall permit the consumption of alcohol beverages on any part of the licensed premises not enclosed within the building, except under permit granted by the city council. Such permits are issued by the council as provided in this article after review by the licensing committee. The permits are a privilege in which no rights vest and, therefore, may be revoked by the council at its pleasure at any time or shall otherwise expire on June 30 of each year. No person shall consume or have in his possession alcohol beverages on any unenclosed part of a licensed premises which is not described in a valid permit. The VFW shall be allowed to permit the consumption of alcohol beverages outside their building in the picnic area as an exception to the requirements of this section.
- b. Limitations on issuance of outdoor permits. No permit shall be issued if any part of the outdoor area is within 50 feet of a structure used for residential purposes, except residential uses located in the same structure as the licensed premises. No permit shall be issued for an outdoor area if the area is

greater than 50 percent of the gross floor area of the adjoining licensed premises. Each application for an outdoor permit shall accurately describe the area intended for use and shall indicate the nature of fencing or other measures intended to provide control over the operation. Amplified sound or music shall not be permitted within the outdoor area of the licensed premises. Outdoor areas permitted pursuant to this section shall be not be open later than 11 p.m. on Fridays and Saturdays, and later than 10 p.m. on all other nights. The council may impose additional restrictions on a case-by-case basis which shall be incorporated into any outdoor consumption permit including, but not limited to, conditions relating to fencing, screening and noise abatement.

Badger Tracs Grant Police Chief Pat O'Connor: Lieutenant Conlin has been working tirelessly to obtain grants to implement Badger Tracs in at the Police Department. Badger Tracs is a program that allows direct access to Department of Transportation Licensing & Registration files for query and submission of data by the officer on the road. This data is obtained via a wireless link to computers in the squad cars. We are trying to structure the grant to allow remote access to our department records as well. Please see Lieutenant Conlin's memo for further information.

Parking at City Hall: Parking restrictions to the area formally known as 5th Street. (5th Street along City Hall was vacated due to the new Fire station): Police Chief Pat O'Connor: In the process of doing parking enforcement we found the ordinance restricting parking at this location may not be applicable due to 5th street being vacated. If we still wish this parking to be regulated we should change the relevant ordinances including:

70-179. No parking by municipal employees.

Except on Sundays and holidays, no vehicle shall be parked or left standing between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m., and on Saturdays between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 12:00 noon, for longer than two hours in the municipal parking lot located adjacent to and west of the city hall, and for a longer period than 30 minutes along that part of the west side of South Fifth Street, to wit: the first two stalls south of the intersection of Main Street and Fifth Street.

Sec. 70-195. Thirty-minute parking limit.

No vehicle shall be parked or left standing for longer than 30 minutes at the following locations:

- (1) On the north side of the alley which is on the west side of 214 South Forrest Street, at the point where the alley intersects South Forrest Street.
- (2) On the two northernmost parking stalls on the west side of the 300 block of South Fifth Street from 7:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday through Friday.

Sec. 70-201. Four-hour parking.

No vehicle shall be parked or left standing for longer than four hours at the following locations:

On the west side of the 300 block of South Fifth Street from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, unless otherwise marked.

Other Information

Use of Force Reports 2008 & 2009: We require officers to report their use of force when they use or threaten to use their firearms, Tasers, baton or pepper spray, and actual use of counter measures. During this period of time there were 63 incidents where there was a use of force. Of these 63 incidents:

- 6 involved drawing a firearm and one discharge of a firearm on a sick animal;
- Tasers were drawn in 10 incidents, and were deployed in 5 incidents. One deployment involved a suicidal woman with a knife. She started lunging towards one of the officers that had responded who in turn deployed his taser and subsequently took her into custody. The second deployment occurred when officers were attempting to take a subject into custody and he resisted. The taser was deployed and the subject was taken into custody without incident. The third deployment occurred when an officer was chasing a suspect and the "victim" tripped and wrestled with the officer. The taser discharged into the ground. The Fourth deployment occurred when officers were investigating a domestic disturbance and the suspect attacked one of the officers. The assisting officer deployed his taser and the subject was taken into custody without further incident. The fifth incident occurred during the arrest of a 7th offense OWI driver who resisted officers at the hospital. The Officers report that the taser has been effective in discouraging suspects from fighting with them.
- O.C.- Pepper spray was used on 1 occasion when an intoxicated subject being transported to detox started to kick the bars over the squad car's window. After being sprayed his eyes were rinsed out and was then transport was completed.
- There were 10 use of force reports on the day shift (0600-1400), 23 reports on the afternoon shift (1400-2200), and 30 on the night shift (2200-0600).

Call to Order: Alderman Larry Weiss called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

EMS Enterprise Fund: Finance Director Laurie Sullivan explained the benefits of using an Enterprise fund. The enterprise fund would be used in place of the general fund for the EMS. They would like the enterprise fund to be considered in the EMS 2010 budget. Moved by McKichan, seconded by Scovotti to recommend the Finance Committee move forward with an enterprise fund for the EMS 2010 Budget.

Moved by McKichan, seconded by Scovotti, to table to the next Public Safety meeting to allow time for Bella Roma to ask the surrounding neighbors how they would feel about the outdoor event and bring the feedback to the next meeting. Staff will check into any outdoor music ordinances. Carried unanimously.

Operator's/Liquor License Renewal Applications:

Mirza Baig, Agent for the Class "A" Beer License for Food Pantry was present in regards to the Class "A" Beer License renewal for Food Pantry due to a citation on his records check. Moved by Scovotti, seconded by McKichan to recommend approval of the license renewal. Carried unanimously.

Abbigail Muzuk, Agent for the Class "A" Beer License for Kwik Trip Store #738 was present in regards to the Class "A" Beer License renewal for Kwik Trip Store #738 due to a citation on her records check. Moved by Scovotti, seconded by McKichan to recommend approval of the license renewal. Carried unanimously.

Application for a "Class B" Beer & Liquor License: Purple Ocean LLC, Robert Viets, Agent dba Cully's Cocktail Lounge located at 210&214 Water Street: Moved by Scovotti, seconded by McKichan to recommend Council grant a "Class B" Beer & Liquor License to Purple Ocean LLC, Robert Veits, Agent, dba Cully's Cocktail Lounge contingent upon no delinquent fines or fees due to the City. (James P. Culligan is surrendering his license liquor license for this premise.) Carried unanimously.

Application for a Class "A" Beer & Liquor License: Gurindeep Singh Dhillon, Agent dba BP Stop- N-Shop located at 1009 W. Main Street: Gurindeep Singh Dhillon presented a plan for the addition of selling liquor at his premises. The plan failed to meet the required conditions for liquors stores held in the past as it did not include a separate store entrance for the liquor store. The plan is coordinated through Dane County Emergency Government and the City's team which consists of EMS Director Cathy Rigdon, Fire Chief Marty Lamers and Police Chief Pat O'Connor. 

Dane County Hazard Mitigation Update: Police Chief Pat O'Connor: Approximately 5 years ago the City of Stoughton participated in and adopted the Hazard Mitigation plan for Dane County. Our participation helps qualify us for FEMA grants as a result of a natural disaster. Periodically, every 5 years, we need to review and update our plan. The review/update is coordinated through Dane County Emergency Government and our team consisting of Cathy Rigdon, Marty Lamers and myself. The most important changes are the city deciding to fix the dam and taking steps to mitigate the retention pond flooding in the Virgin Lake area.

Request for placing a "Slow Children at Play" sign on Nygaard Street across from the Taco Bell: I have reviewed this request along with the city's sign placement policy. This policy states that warning or informational signs should be considered when there is an indicator that an unusual or unique condition exists in the area. The use of signs should be limited unless deemed essential, so as not to dilute their effectiveness. Traffic Engineering reports indicate that traffic control and warning signs are not effective at slowing traffic, and should therefore not be placed for this sole purpose (Ref. WI AAA Study). In reviewing the area, although I'm sure there is more traffic volume I don't see this as a unusual or unique situation as the area is readily identifiable as residential & children would be present. There was not a significant accident history in this location.

Request for placing a 3-way stop sign at the intersection of Milwaukee Street and S. Van Buren Street: My understanding is the purpose of the this request is to slow down vehicles coming into the city. In reviewing the sign placement policy Van Buren Street is designated as a through street and is designed to keep traffic flowing. In reviewing the accident data there does not appear to be a significant accident history at this location. Additionally, the placement of stop signs to control speeds has been shown not to be effective. It should be noted that Milwaukee Street is also a through street and at such time it goes through the 4 way stop should be reconsidered. Today I'm not recommending a 3 way stop but instead use of other speed control measures should be used.



Bella Roma Outdoor Consumption Permit: It would appear that this request is not in line with ordinance 14-40(k)(6). The ordinance limits the outdoor area to no more than 50 percent of the gross floor area of the adjoining licensed premises. Additionally, the ordinance prohibits amplified sound or music within the outdoor area of the licensed premises. My assumption is the band area will include amplified music.



BUSINESSES § 14-40

Sec. 14-38. Issuance of license.

- (a) The public safety committee shall give any person the opportunity to be heard for or against the issuance of any license. Upon the receipt of a timely application received by the city clerk, ap-X proval of the application by the city council and after payment of license fee, the city clerk shall issue the applicant a license. Each license shall be numbered in the order in which issued and shall specifically state the premises for which issued, the date of issuance, fee paid and the name of the licensee. All licenses shall remain in force until June 30 following the issuance thereof, unless revoked or suspended in the manner provided by statute or this chapter. Renewal licenses will be issued one day later than July 1 for each day after April 15 (due date established by statute) that the application is received and/or one day later than July 1 for each day later than June 15 that the fee is received (due date established by statute).
- (b) Where the applicant's premises are not in compliance with relevant ordinances and/or state codes at the time of application, the application may be accepted with the provisal that the license shall be granted and issued only upon the applicant's compliance with applicable ordinances and codes within 90 days of acceptance. If the applicant's premises are not in compliance within the 90-day period, the acceptance shall be withdrawn.

(Code 1986, § 12.03(6))

Sec. 14-39. General licensing requirements.

In addition to the requirements set forth in section 14-33, all license applicants and licensees shall strictly comply with the following provisions:

- (1) Conformity to statutes and ordinances. No license shall be issued or renewed unless the premises conform to the sanitary, safety and health requirements of the state building code, plumbing code and the rules and regulations of the state department of health applicable to restaurants, as well as all ordinances and regulations adopted by the city.
- (2) City claims. No license shall be issued or renewed for operation on any premises

upon which taxes or assessments or other financial claims of the city are delinquent and unpaid.

(Code 1986, § 12.03(7))

Sec. 14-40. Operation by licensee under Class A or B license; additional city regulations.

- (a) View of interior unobstructed.
- (1) Blinds, screens and partitions. No holder of a retail Class B fermented malt beverage license under this article shall permit the interior of the premises to be obstructed, provided that partitions, etc., not exceeding 48 inches in height, may be permitted within the interior. This subsection shall not apply to a licensed premises where the principal business conducted is that of a restaurant or hotel.
- (2) Windows and doors. Windows and doors of any licensed premises shall not be obstructed by screens, blinds, paints or other articles, provided articles not higher than 48 inches from the sidewalk level shall be permitted. This subsection does not apply to a licensed premises where the principal business conducted is that of a restaurant or hotel.
- (b) Alcohol beverages to be sold and consumed only in authorized parts of premises.
 - (1) No alcohol beverage may be sold, dispensed or consumed under a Class B license in more than one room upon the same licensed premises. This subsection shall not prohibit the consumption of such beverages in bottles or other original containers in rooms occupied by guests in hotels, nor shall it prohibit the serving of such beverages in additional rooms in the same building on the same premises when these rooms are open to the public for the service of meals.
 - (2) No alcohol beverage may be sold, dispensed or consumed under a Class B license in any portion of the building or premises not authorized in the license, outside the building or premises not au-

thorized in the license, outside the building on the premises or within any temporary shelter or tent on the premises.

- (c) Posting. Every license issued under this chapter shall be posted in a conspicuous place, while in force, in the room or place where alcohol beverages are kept for sale. No person shall post such licenses or permit such licenses to be posted upon premises other than those mentioned on the application. No person shall knowingly deface or destroy such license or remove such license without the permission of the licensee. If a license is lost or destroyed through no fault of the holder, a duplicate thereof under the original application shall be issued by the city clerk if the clerk is satisfied as to the facts upon payment of a \$5.00 fee.
- (d) Credit restrictions. No licensee shall sell or offer to sell any alcohol beverage to any person on credit, except credit extended by a hotel to a resident guest or a club to a bona fide member, and by grocers and druggists who maintain a credit system in connection with other purchases as well. No licensee shall sell alcohol beverages to any person on a passbook or store order or receive from any person any goods, wares, merchandise or other articles in exchange for alcohol beverages.
- (e) Gambling prohibited. Except as provided by law, no person shall permit gambling or devices used for gambling upon any premises licensed under this chapter.
- (f) Licensee, manager or other operator on premises. There shall be upon premises operated under a retail Class A or B license at all times the licensee or some person who shall be responsible for acts of all persons serving in any manner alcohol beverages to customers. No person other than the licensee shall serve alcohol beverages in any place operating under a retail Class A or Class B license unless he possesses an operator's or manager's license or unless he is under the immediate supervision of the licensee or a person holding an operator's or manager's license who shall be upon the premises at the time of service.

- (g) Consent to inspection of premises. The holder of any license issued under this article shall be deemed to have given consent to entry and inspection at any time by any police officer or alderperson without warrant. Refusal by the licensee or holder of a manager's or operator's license to permit such inspection shall be deemed a violation of this article.
- (h) Presence on premises after hours under retail Class B license.
 - (1) The licensee, employees, salesperson or service personnel shall be permitted to be present, but not to consume alcohol beverages, on licensed premises during hours when the premises are not open for business if those persons are performing jobrelated activities.
 - (2) Commercial janitorial service personnel shall be allowed to enter the licensed premises for the purpose of cleaning during hours the establishment is not permitted to be open for business. The premises shall be well-lighted during cleanup.
- (i) Open containers restrictions. No licensee, manager or operator shall permit any patron to leave the licensed premises with an open container containing any alcohol beverage.
- (j) Health rules. Each premises shall be maintained and conducted in a sanitary manner and shall be a safe and proper place for the purpose for which used. The building inspector is authorized and empowered to make reasonable and general rules for the sanitation of all places of business possessing licenses under this chapter. Such rules and regulations may be classified and made applicable to the class of business conducted. All these rules and regulations shall have the same force as this chapter and an infraction thereof may be punished as a violation of this chapter.
 - (k) Miscellaneous rules.
 - (1) Consent to inspection. Every applicant procuring a license thereby consents to the entry of a city officer or other duly authorized representative of the city at all reasonable hours for the purpose of inspection and search, consents to the removal

from the premises of all things and articles found in violation of ordinances or law, and consents to the introduction of such things and articles in evidence in any prosecution that may be brought for such offenses.

- (2) Employment of underage persons. No licensee shall employ an underage person in violation of Wis. Stats. § 125.07.
- (3) *Clubs*. No club shall sell intoxicating liquors except to members and guests invited by members.
- (4) Orderly conduct required. Each licensed premises shall at all times be conducted in an orderly manner and no disorderly, riotous or indecent conduct shall be allowed at any time on any licensed premises.
- (5) Alcohol beverages 'content. No beverages of an alcohol content prohibited by law shall be kept in or about licensed premises.

 χ (6)

Permits for outdoor consumption at Class B premises.

a. Required for outdoor consumption. No licensee shall permit the consumption of alcohol beverages on any part of the licensed premises not enclosed within the building, except under permit granted by the city council. Such permits are issued by the council as provided in this article after review by the licensing committee. The permits are a privilege in which no rights vest and, therefore, may be revoked by the council at its pleasure at any time or shall otherwise expire on June 30 of each year. No person shall consume or have in his possession alcohol beverages on any unenclosed part of a licensed premises which is not described in a valid permit. The VFW shall be allowed to permit the consumption of alcohol beverages outside their building in the picnic area as an exception to the requirements of this section

- Limitations on issuance of outdoor permits. No permit shall be issued if any part of the outdoor area is within 50 feet of a structure used for residential purposes, except residential uses located in the same structure as the licensed premises. No permit shall be issued for an outdoor area if the area is greater than 50 percent of the gross floor area of the adjoining licensed premises. Each application for an outdoor permit shall accurately describe the area intended for use and shall indicate the nature of fencing or other measures intended to provide control over the operation. Amplified sound or music shall not be permitted within the outdoor area of the licensed premises. Outdoor areas permitted pursuant to this section shall be not be open later than 11:00 p.m. on Fridays and Saturdays, and later than 10:00 p.m. on all other nights. The council may impose additional restrictions on a case-by-case basis which shall be incorporated into any outdoor consumption permit including, but not limited to, conditions relating to fencing, screening and noise abatement.
- (l) Closing hours. Establishments holding a retail Class B intoxicating liquor license shall be closed between 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. on weekdays and between 2:30 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. on Saturdays and Sundays. On January 1, premises operating under a Class B license are not required to close. No alcohol beverages shall be served or consumed during hours when the premises is closed.
- (m) Prohibition of carryout sales. No person shall sell or permit to be sold on premises for which a retail fermented malt beverage license or retail intoxicating liquor license has been issued any intoxicating liquor or fermented malt bever-

Badger Tracs Grant Police Chief Pat O'Connor: Lieutenant Conlin has been working tirelessly to obtain grants to implement Badger Tracs in at the Police Department. Badger Tracs is a program that allows direct access to Department of Transportation Licensing & Registration files for query and submission of data by the officer on the road. This data is obtained via a wireless link to computers in the squad cars. We are trying to structure the grant to allow remote access to our department records as well. Please see Lieutenant Conlin's memo for further information.

Parking at City Hall: Parking restrictions to the area formally known as 5th Street. (5th Street along City Hall was vacated due to the new Fire station): Police Chief Pat O'Connor: In the process of doing parking enforcement we found the ordinance restricting parking at this location may not be applicable due to 5th street being vacated. If we still wish this parking to be regulated we should change the relevant ordinances including:

70-179. No parking by municipal employees.

Except on Sundays and holidays, no vehicle shall be parked or left standing between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m., and on Saturdays between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 12:00 noon, for longer than two hours in the municipal parking lot located adjacent to and west of the city hall, and for a longer period than 30 minutes along that part of the west side of South Fifth Street, to wit: the first two stalls south of the intersection of Main Street and Fifth Street.

RE: Badger TraCS e-citation Grant Program

We were contacted by Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT) regarding implementation of automated citations, warnings and accident reports in our squad cars. After submitting a proposal for the project, WisDOT offered to fund \$42,000 of the equipment which left us short \$30,000. To complete the project, I've applied for remainder of the funds through private, State, and Federal resources.

This project includes 7 laptop computers in police vehicles that connect to a dedicated server at City Hall. The information is stored on the server and accessed by laptop. The officer would have the ability to run drivers and vehicles that would fill in the information for traffic citations, warning and accident reports.

This program will benefit both the City of Stoughton and WisDOT in many ways. I've listed many of the benefits to both.

The benefits to the City of Stoughton are:

- Efficiency with operations and personnel
- Estimated 50% time savings on issuing citations, increasing officer safety
- Disaster plans, maps and other resources available in the squad cars
- Instant communications through the laptop to dispatch for confidential info
 Juvenile information, criminal records, sexual assaults
- Increased productivity by completing accident reports in field
- Remote access to e-mail and other timely information
- Access to TiPSS records and reports from laptop (previous contacts/warnings)
- Access on-line phone records, sex offenders, Amber Alerts and weather alerts
- Access current weather maps and storms
- View IP cameras at the Stoughton Schools through the laptops
- View any IP cameras set up for surveillance
- Access Circuit Court Access for records and current restraining & other orders
- Access officer training material on the Internet (www.wilenet.org)
- Cost savings to court as forms will be electronically processed, not mailed
- Reduction in errors for citations, warnings, and accident reports
- Easier to read citations, warnings and accident reports over handwritten
- Timely reporting of dispositions, accident reports and other forms
- Agencies report an increase in citations and warnings

The benefits to WisDOT are all of the accident report forms, citations, dispositions, and related communications is sent from TiPSS to WisDOT electronically. The process now

is to manually write out the forms, mail them to WisDOT and they manually enter the forms into the computer.

City of Stoughton Public Use AED (Automatic External Defibrillator) Policy

Goal:

To provide AEDs to first responders and city departments to assist in the chain of survival of patients in sudden cardiac arrest.

Objectives:

To provide mobile AEDs to first responders (police, fire, EMS, public works, utilities) and fixed public use AEDs to city departments (municipal buildings) to assist with early access, activation and defibrillation for victims of sudden cardiac arrest.

To provide Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR), Automatic External Defibrillation (AED) and Cardiocerebral Resuscitation (CCR) Training to city personnel.

Responsibilities:

Stoughton Area EMS will:

- Provide CPR/AED/CCR Training to city departments.
- Maintain an asset/inventory list of AEDs.
- Provide an annual on-site inspection of AEDs.

City departments utilizing/housing an AED will:

- Ensure CPR/AED/CCR Training is provided to departmental employees.
- Provide replacement cost of batteries and supplies (pads), as needed.
- Notify Stoughton Area EMS of any operational/functional problems associated with devices.

Disclosure:

This policy will be in effect throughout the life of the Philips HeartStart FRx Defibrillators obtained and distributed by Stoughton Area Emergency Medical Services. The defibrillators are to be considered property of Stoughton Area EMS. Stoughton Area EMS will conduct annual inventory/inspection of the devices.

Each application for an outdoor permit shall accurately describe the area intended for use and shall indicate the nature of fencing or other measures intended to provide control over the operation. Amplified sound or music shall not be permitted within the outdoor area of the licensed premises. Outdoor areas permitted pursuant to this section shall be not be open later than 11 p.m. on Fridays and Saturdays, and later than 10 p.m. on all other nights. The council may impose additional restrictions on a case-by-case basis which shall be incorporated into any outdoor consumption permit including, but not limited to, conditions relating to fencing, screening and noise abatement.

Badger Tracs Grant Police Chief Pat O'Connor: Lieutenant Conlin has been working tirelessly to obtain grants to implement Badger Tracs in at the Police Department. Badger Tracs is a program that allows direct access to Department of Transportation Licensing & Registration files for query and submission of data by the officer on the road. This data is obtained via a wireless link to computers in the squad cars. We are trying to structure the grant to allow remote access to our department records as well. Please see Lieutenant Conlin's memo for further information.



Parking at City Hall: Parking restrictions to the area formally known as 5th Street. (5th Street along City Hall was vacated due to the new Fire station): Police Chief Pat O'Connor: In the process of doing parking enforcement we found the ordinance restricting parking at this location may not be applicable due to 5th street being vacated. If we still wish this parking to be regulated we should change the relevant ordinances including:

70-179. No parking by municipal employees.

Except on Sundays and holidays, no vehicle shall be parked or left standing between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m., and on Saturdays between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 12:00 noon, for longer than two hours in the municipal parking lot located adjacent to and west of the city hall, and for a longer period than 30 minutes along that part of the west side of South Fifth Street, to wit: the first two stalls south of the intersection of Main Street and Fifth Street.

Sec. 70-195. Thirty-minute parking limit.

No vehicle shall be parked or left standing for longer than 30 minutes at the following locations:

- (1) On the north side of the alley which is on the west side of 214 South Forrest Street, at the point where the alley intersects South Forrest Street.
- (2) On the two northernmost parking stalls on the west side of the 300 block of South Fifth Street from 7:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday through Friday.

Sec. 70-201. Four-hour parking.

No vehicle shall be parked or left standing for longer than four hours at the following locations:

On the west side of the 300 block of South Fifth Street from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, unless otherwise marked.
