Roger,

As you know, the RDA has not been flooded with interest to develop this site. I further believe the RDA has generally been pleased with the concept presented by Curt Brink and the interactions with him and his team to date. I see the Letter of Intent as an opportunity to further nurture this relationship and vet out the specifics over the next 60 days with a Master Development Agreement.

The RDA has succeeded in preparing the Millfab site for development with the general understanding that the City will be conveying the Public Works property to the RDA or developer as part of the development. It seems to me that the RDA could support the letter of intent and move forward with the drafting of the Master Development Agreement. Since the Public Works site will not be transferred to the RDA within 60 days, it seems necessary for the City to play a role in the Master Development Agreement approval.

I think it is also important to highlight that Curt Brink recently hired a surveyor (I believe it is about \$20,000 for this aspect of the survey work) to survey all of the properties including the Public Works Facility including the topography. This investment will allow him to understand fully understand the sites and help with stormwater management design, utility layout, building basement elevations, etc.

I see the Letter of Intent a step forward.
