	The commission shall be composed of six citizen members competent and informed in the historical, architectural and cultural traditions of the city, to be recommended for approval by the Landmarks Commission and appointed by the mayor subject to city council confirmation by majority vote. All citizen members may be appointed for three years as terms expire. Citizen members may be appointed to successive terms. A seventh member shall be a common council member to be appointed by the mayor subject to council confirmation by majority vote. In addition, the zoning administrator shall be an ad hoc member of the commission and shall not be entitled to a vote. If any vacancy occurs, the Landmarks Commission shall inform the mayor of potential new members with appropriate qualifications. The mayor, in consultation with the Landmarks Commission, shall appoint a person subject to the city council confirmation for the unexpired term. The commission may suggest a candidate to the mayor for appointment. No compensation shall be paid to commission members except for expenses necessary in carrying out their duties. The commission shall annually select from its members a chair, vice-chair and secretary and shall fill vacancies in such offices.
