August 22, 2022, Stoughton Sustainability Committee Meeting

6:04 Call to order

Members present: Ben Heili, Scott Taylor, Heath Massey, Jeff Leverich, Donelle Scaffidi, John Hallinan

Also present: Mayor Swadley, Sharon Lezberg, Michelle Probst, Sarah Esmond from Diversity, Equity, Inclusion committee

Communications

Sharon Lezberg: Interpreters available through her office will be available if needed, she stresses we will need to reach out to underserved groups. School board/district best mechanism to reach out these communities. Jeff will reach out to Stoughton Dems & Progressives

Sarah from DEI introduces herself. Discusses DEI survey of city staff. Aim to create a strategic plan by fall of 2023.

Discussion of incorporating DEI survey questions into our survey, or other means of coordinating surveys.

Donelle suggests we meet every other week to hasten progress on open house and to facilitate subcommittee meetings. We will consider having every other meeting virtual only.

Jeff moves that we meet every other week through mid-October or completion of Survey whichever is later. Scott seconds motion.

Mayor shows us DEI link on website and offers our committee the same. He also mentions we can put our flier on Facebook. City has quarterly digital quarterly publication.

Approval of July 25, 2022, Minutes

Ben moves to approve 7-25-22 meeting minutes. Scott seconds.

Public Engagement Update

Michelle Probst: changed title of event to "Community Dialogue". Michelle reviews community dialogue agenda. Clarifies that there will be 6 tables but there will only be 3 table sessions so participants will have to choose 3 out 6 tables.

Sharon proposes having an exit evaluation form asking participants what their 3 favored sustainability initiatives would be.

John suggests having participants writing their ideas on notes rather than host writing on flip chart.

We review the two draft fliers for the community dialogue. The majority of members prefer the draft with fewer words.

Michelle urges committee members to promote event through each of our networks. Post fliers in as many different, and diverse, businesses as possible.

Sarah suggests reframing our outreach. Suggests the term "sustainability" may not resonate with some community members. Also emphasizes the importance of allowing our focus areas to form organically from public comments rather than defining them ourselves.

Sharon suggests we assign event outreach tasks to committee members. Committee agrees and proceeds to assign outreach tasks that were identified in subcommittee.

- 1. Vision statements typically broad; aspirational statement of what we hope to achieve, guides the direction of actions
 - Example from McFarland, ENERGY Focus Area: Village government, residents and businesses embrace energy efficiency strategies and renewable energy sources. Efforts are aimed at reducing the local use of energy derived from fossil fuels each year, making steady progress toward a 100% clean energy future.

 Example from Middleton, ENERGY: The City of Middleton is a leader in energy efficiency and renewable energy generation and use. Public and private energy users are using innovative technologies to make Middleton a "net zero" City that produces all of its energy needs from renewable sources within the City limits.

2. Goals - follows from big picture vision, breaks it down a little but still broad

Note: These goals may change with city and public input but it will be good to have as a starting point. The next level of specificity after goals will be generated from the municipal and public engagement process.

- 3. Protect the Yahara River watershed and surrounding lakes and tributaries from harmful non-point source pollution and runoff to maintain and improve the quality of our community's water resources.

Solid Waste Management

Vision

Facilitate the reduction in the amount of waste sent to the landfill, while decreasing the amount of waste generated overall. Hazardous waste disposal - make it easy for residents.

The city acknowledges that raw land is a precious resource and strives to increase developed areas conservatively, only as needed to meet the needs of its growing population. As the city grows, it strives to elevate the status of pedestrians and bicyclists to those of automobiles.

New development and redevelopment in Stoughton is guided toward sustainable practices, including net-zero energy use, surface water runoff reduction and non-motorized transportation.

The City of Stoughton encourages compact, efficient growth that incorporates mixed use development, diversity of housing types, thriving businesses, and preserved and restored natural habitats.
