Hirsch said that the connection to HWY 138 would not have to happen until a percentage of the homes were built, but she would like to see the connection to Roby Rd to happen right away for public safety reasons. Chief Leck said that the northern route would be preferable to alleviate traffic on Jackson Street. Ron Henshue of Forward Development said that the north connection would be made during the first phase. He added that the connection to 138 will happen; they just need to figure out the timing and configuration.

Motion by Riley, second by Bartlett to approve option B (not requiring the connection to 138 before the construction of the North Addition). Motion carried 10-2 with Hirsch and Caravello voting 'no'.
