CALL TO ORDER

Roll Call, Communications, and Presentations: Mayor Swadley called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

Clerk Licht called the roll and noted that there were 11 alders present. Majewski was absent and excused.

- White Cane Awareness Day Proclamation
- Heili stated that the CACP is working on a resolution to recognize Indigenous People's Day.
- Bartlett stated that the Tree Commission held the first lumber sale. They sold \$1500 worth of lumber.
- Caravello stated that they had over 60 people come and give input on the Downtown Revitalization plan.

<u>Minutes and Reports:</u> the following minutes were entered into the record. Utilities (8/19/19); CACP (9/3/19)

Public Comment Period:

- Bob Diebel, 316 Grant Street, spoke regarding the CIP, specifically sidewalks. He said that in an old neighborhood that it is not appropriate to put sidewalks on each side. He said sidewalks on Grant and McKinley would be appropriate.
- Joanne Thornton, 404 Grant Street, spoke regarding the CIP, specifically sidewalks. She said that traffic is not concerning enough to add sidewalks. She said that council needs to create a new policy.
- Steve Royko, 148 E. Prospect St., spoke regarding sidewalks in the CIP. He said that landscaping and very old trees would be negatively impacted. The neighborhood is quiet and safe. He said that the council needed to rid of a "one-size fits all policy" for sidewalk.
- Kay Rashka, 325 N. Page St., spoke regarding sidewalk in the CIP. She said that the sidewalk ordinance was written in 1997 when Stoughton was growing at a rapid rate.
- Lorie Oler, 123 E. Taft St., spoke regarding sidewalks in the CIP. She said that sidewalks would destroy the neighborhood.
- Al Olson, 124 W. Prospect St., spoke regarding sidewalks in the CIP. He stated that a one-size fits all policy does not fit this neighborhood.
- Pam Tolefson, 125 W. McKinley, spoke in opposition of the sidewalks in the CIP.

Motion by Schumacher, second by Jenson to approve R-155-2019 Authorizing and directing the proper City official (s) to enter into an agreement with Robinson Brothers Environmental, Inc. for the 2019 Demolition/Abatement of Former Public Works Facility. Schumacher stated it was the low bid and the demolition would be completed before the end of the calendar year. Motion carried 11-0.

<u>**R-156-2019**</u>- Authorizing and directing the proper City official(s) to approve the City of Stoughton five-year (2020-2024) Capital Improvement Plan (CIP)

Motion by Jenson, second by Heili to approve R-156-2019 Authorizing and directing the proper City official(s) to approve the City of Stoughton five-year (2020-2024) Capital Improvement Plan (CIP).

Motion by Riley, second by Boersma to amend the CIP Plan to remove planned sidewalk construction on Grant, Sherman and Prospect Streets. Riley stated that the neighborhood has thrived for 80 years without sidewalks. There have been no vehicular incidents. He said that the City budget is tight and the planned sidewalks are not necessary when the City can't fund requested personnel. Boersma stated that one particular property that would have to move a garage. He stated that there were several old trees that would need to removed. Doom agreed with Boersma. Reeves said that the neighborhood was very quiet and safe and sidewalks are not necessary. Jenson stated that the CIP is earmarking the money for the projects and there will be an opportunity to remove the sidewalks when the projects come before the council. Heili stated that he doesn't think sidewalks fit this neighborhood. Mayor Swadley stated that sidewalks that stop mid-block are not serving any purpose. Attorney Dregne said whether or not you include the money in the CIP, the council will still have to come back and decide whether the sidewalks will go in. Motion carried on a roll call vote of 7-4 with Heili, Hirsch, Jenson and Bartlett voted 'no'.

Motion by Reeves, second by Ligocki to amend the CIP to remove funding of sidewalk construction on Grant, Sherman and Prospect Streets with the exception of the maintenance of existing sidewalks. Reeves withdrew her motion.

Motion by Boersma, second by Heili to remove the motor patrol unit for the Police Department from the CIP. Boersma stated that he didn't think a \$20,000 motorcycle for the PD was not necessary. Chief Leck stated that the request was for traffic control. It would be an addition to what is currently in place. Motion failed on a vote of 5-6 with Doom, Hirsch, Jenson, Ligocki, Schumacher and Bartlett voting 'no'

Motion Reeves, second by Caravello to amend the amount that landmarks have requested to \$13,000 and include \$8,000 for an accessible van. Motion carried 11-0.

Original motion as amended twice carried 11-0.

Discussion and possible action relating to questions regarding Kettle Park West Phase 2 Tax Incremental Financing (TIF) request

Mayor Swadley presented the original request from 2016 vs. the latest request. The original request was \$11 million and the current request is for \$7 million. There was discussion on the pay-go design, when the TIF would close and future enrollment in the Stoughton School District. The Mayor requested that the council change the date of when they will vote on the application due to it being the week of Thanksgiving.
