<u>Discussion only item</u>: Application by RHD Properties, LLC for Tax Incremental Financing ("TIF") assistance for the project known as 51 West***

Director Friedl introduced the material in the packet as informational only and noted this item will be on the agendas for decision at the August 4, 2021 Finance Committee and the August 10, 2021 City Council meetings.

Hirsch requested a breakdown of what the costs would have been had the upgrades to sanitary sewer and water infrastructure not been requested by the City and Utilities.

Tikalsky requested additional detail from the developer under the market analysis section on page 7. The representative from the development team acknowledged this request.

Heili contested the language regarding "developer funded" because the TIF will be paying the developer back. The development team acknowledged this request.

Majewski inquired how much of the demand requiring the upgrades to sanitary sewer and water infrastructure will be created by this development. Director Scheel stated the additional utility infrastructure requirements will be need serve future developments to the West of this site that are included in the City's comprehensive plan as well.
