Communications-CACP Structure for Sustainability/Climate Change

The group decided that they would come back January 7th with targets and priorities to set the schedule for 2020.

Energy Targets:

Cory Neely of WPPI gave an overview of where Stoughton was at with solar energy. He stated that there were many residential and commercial properties that have installed renewables. He said he would like to see the City purchase RECs (renewable energy blocks). He said that as a whole, the city should start to make projects renewable ready during construction. Heili stated that he would like to partner with other WPPI members to promote more sustainable energies. The committee said they would like to have Cory Neely and Jill Weiss back to discuss more in the future.

Discussion and possible action regarding recognizing the second Monday in October as Indigenous People's Day

There is no update for now. Heili spoke with Jim Ramsey at the library to have some of the local history section to include more indigenous history.

Discussion and possible action regarding a Joint School Board/City Committee meeting
